REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

Dear Charleston County School District (CCSD) Parents and Community Members:

Report cards are all about results, so I want to begin by sharing some important data with you about our students and the continued progress they are making. CCSD earned its best state report card on record with an "Excellent" growth rating and "Good" absolute rating, and more CCSD students moved to "Exemplary" on elementary and middle school standardized assessments when compared to the state average.

Our seniors earned over \$48 million dollars in scholarships, their highest earnings on record, and half of CCSD students attend "Excellent" schools—nearly twice the state average. Our graduation rate jumped five points, from 67% to 72%, and our literacy academies continue to boost reading levels and narrow achievement gaps in the early grades. These results show we are making tremendous strides, but achievement gaps have not closed, and far too many CCSD students are not graduating with the skills necessary to succeed in college, careers, and life.

It's time to aim even higher and focus on closing the achievement gap. This past year – to help accomplish this – CCSD launched a volunteer-led community engagement process to prepare for the next stage of the strategic plan—Charleston Achieving Excellence: Vision 2016. Over the course of last year, 10 community engagement meetings were held to discuss the creation of a new five-year strategic plan. Three things became very clear: 1) It was time to extend, strengthen and revise the current plan; 2) More must be done to close the achievement gap and improve literacy; and 3) Parents, district leaders, and community stakeholders were encouraged but not satisfied.

Vision 2016 strengthens the district's emphasis on literacy improvement and teacher effectiveness and creates bold annual performance targets for all students. It raises expectations, increases our accountability, and builds a student-centered culture of performance management. Vision 2016 is all about focusing on what works and centering the work of a large, complex organization on one truth: The Victory is in the Classroom! Vision 2016 has four focus areas: 1) Literacy-Based Education; 2) Educator Effectiveness; 3) Innovative Schools and Systems; and 4) Partnerships.

As we enter the 2012 – 2013 school year, we want to make substantial improvements in closing the achievement gaps between Caucasian, African-American, and Hispanic students. We believe that with the right supports, high expectations and great teaching, every student can graduate from high school with the skills to succeed in life. It is our job – together with parents and community partners – to make sure this happens.

I am encouraged by our progress, but we can and must do better. With the right leaders, a budget that invests in our talented educators, and our strategic plan, we will do better. I thank our teachers, staff, parents, and community leaders for their continued partnership, hard work, and commitment to our students' bright future.
